These Women Were Told Not to Play Football. Instead They Formed a Team.

In Zanzibar, you see children playing football very frequently, and people watching football matches on TVs in restaurants, like anywhere else. What you don't see are women playing. However, a group of Zanzibari women have started to confront a culture that says only men can play football.

Riziki Abdallah is a star of the Zanzibari women's national football team. She is better known by her nickname, Chadole, which means "from Dole," the rural village of a thousand people where she grew up. She started playing football when she was eleven, after a coach showed up in her school classroom and asked if any girl wanted to go to Tanzania to play in a match. "He said they needed girls, and that was my chance", Ms. Abdallah said. When she came back, she started training in the early mornings in the sand along the nearby Zanzibari coast.

Riziki Abdallah is part of a community of six teams that form the women's club football league in Zanzibar. Despite societal pressures derived from conservative beliefs about the role of women, the athletes in the Zanzibari women's league persist, rallying together without resources or support because of their love of the game. "People have tried to stop me from playing," said Ms. Abdallah. "They say: 'Don't play football. Football is only for men." "But I am committed to playing," she said. "I am not afraid of anything."
