As a Spanish City Lights Up for Christmas, So Does a Debate

Vigo, a well-known Galician industrial hub and Spain's largest fishing port, switched on its Christmas lights on Nov. 23, ahead of the long holiday weekend to celebrate Spain's Constitution. At a news conference before the holiday season, Vigo's mayor, Abel Caballero, said that the lights of Vigo were the best on the planet and that they would outshine New York, which lies across the Atlantic on the same latitude.

The Council of Vigo spent one million euros decorating the city with ten million Christmas lights. In a coastal city used to powerful Atlantic storms but not snow, a dozen snow-making machines were deployed to spray flakes for two minutes every hour. Attracted by the show, thousands of visitors went to visit Vigo's lights display. The city hotels reported full occupancy during the Spain's Constitution long holiday weekend. Two decades ago, on the same Constitution holiday, hotels had an occupancy rate of 20 percent.

But not everybody is happy with this investment in Christmas lights and snow-making machines. Environmentalists, for example, want mayors like Mr. Caballero to reduce light pollution in the cities. "It seems an absurd contradiction that Spain held a climate change summit just as Vigo competed with other Spanish cities for who could switch on the most Christmas lights," said Serafín González Prieto, the president of the Galician Society of Natural History, a regional nongovernmental organization.
